Sh. Manjeet Singh on 27th November, 2023

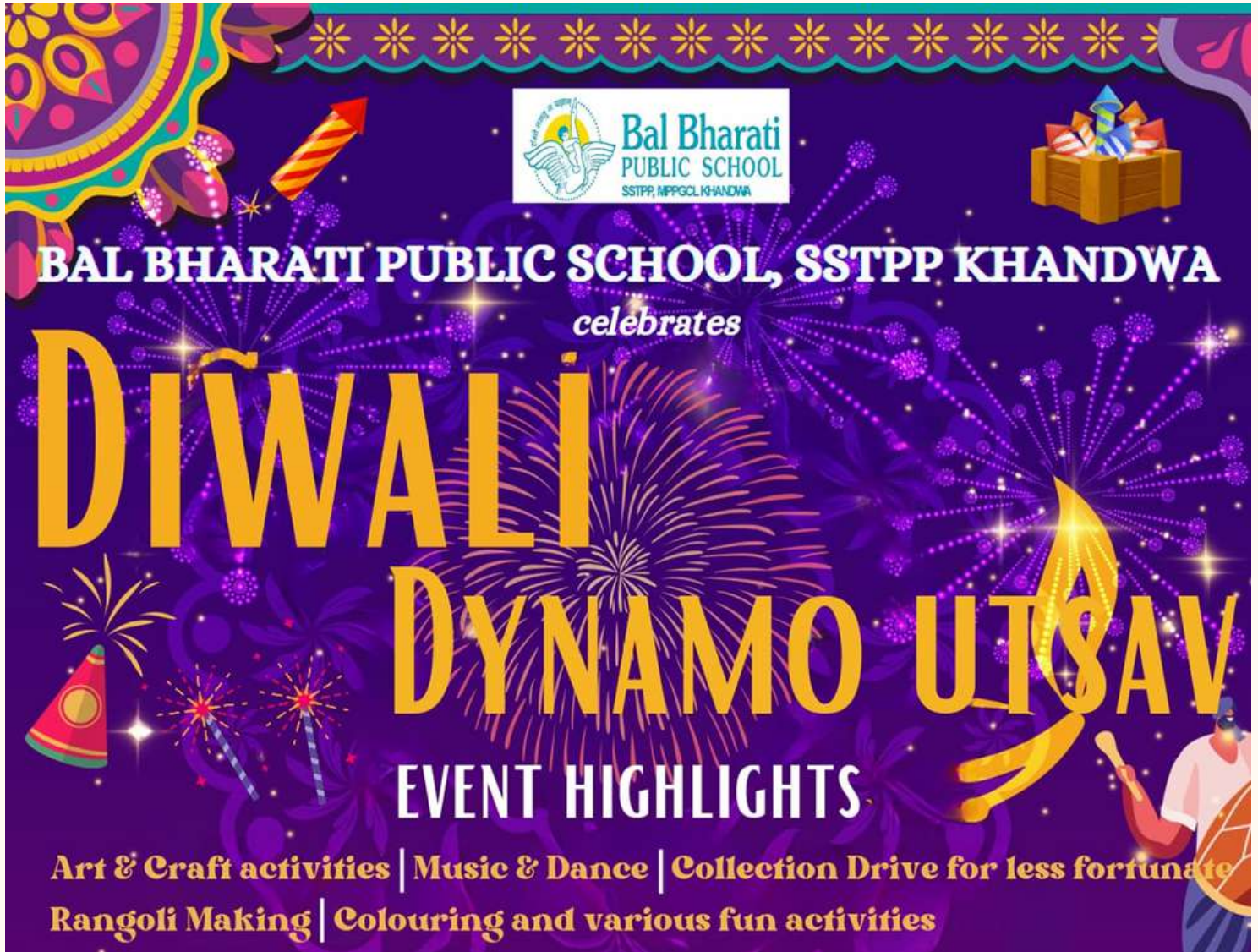

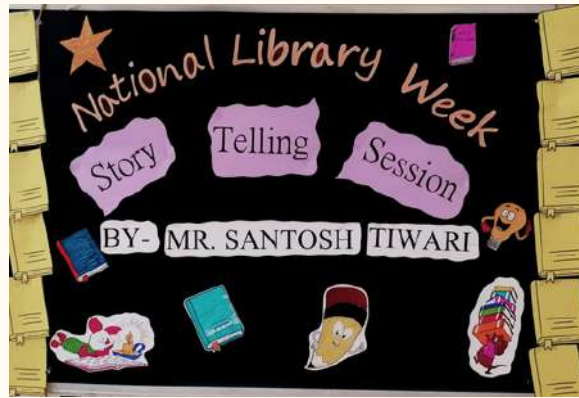
NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK

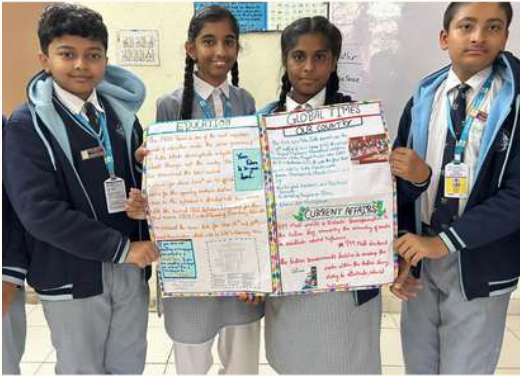
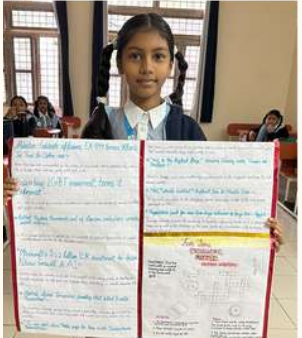

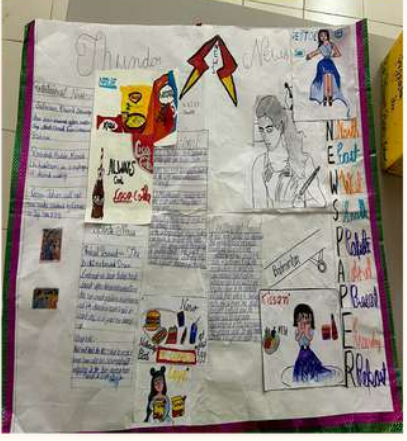
Pumpkin and Walnut

On 4th August 2023, Bal Bharati Public School Khandwa organised a seminar on the topic "Unveiling the Mystery of Gravity" for the students of Class V to VII. The guest speaker of the seminar was Er. Javed Saeed, Assistant Engineer, MPPGCL Khandwa who as a resource person shared important facts, research, hypothesis and law related to gravity. The key objective was to bring out the hidden talents of students and with a focus on creating more awareness of science, technology and engineering. Students learnt about the famous scientist and philosopher such as Thales, Aristotle, Brahmputra, Galileo & Isaac Newton. The main idea of the seminar was to reveal the concept of gravity with the changing eras. Experiments were performed by applying the gravity concepts along with conceptual videos (Gravitational Physics).
